

Scholarships Promote Diversity in Legal Profession

Four multicultural students learned today that they have been selected for scholarships from the Idaho State Bar's Diversity Section. The students plan to study law and were given up to \$1,440 each.

To qualify, recipients must sit for the September 2017 or December 2017 Law School Admissions Test (LSAT) and must apply for admission to a law school in Idaho. Each scholarship covers the LSAT study course, LSAT test fee, and law school application fee.

The Diversity Section promotes diversity, equality, and cultural understanding throughout the Idaho State Bar to better serve the state's diverse citizenry. The scholarship is named in honor of Jennifer King who spent the last years of her life working to increase access to legal study for diverse students hoping to increase the diversity of the Idaho State Bar.
