Agency Mission

The mission of TLAP is threefold:

- 1. to **protect** the interests of clients, litigants and the general public from harm caused by impaired lawyers or judges;
- 2. to assist impaired members of the legal profession to begin and continue recovery; and
- 3. to educate the bench and bar to the causes of and remedies for impairments affecting members of the legal profession.



19 % experience anxiety.


11.5 % have reported suicidal thoughts.

The 65%: Self and Third-party





- Listen and/or consult
- Schedule an appointment with staff or volunteer
- Make a referral to outside resource
- Assist in goal making and accountability
- Include in activities
- Follow-up/check-ins







Rule 10. CODE OF JUDICAL CONDUCT

 Rule 2.14 Disability and Impairment

A judge having reasonable belief that the performance of a lawyer or another judge is impaired by drugs or alcohol, or by a mental, emotional or physical condition, shall take appropriate action, which may include a confidential referral to a lawyer or judicial assistance program.




