Keynote Presenter Jeffrey Rosen



Jeffrey Rosen is the President and Chief Executive Officer of the National Constitution Center, the first and only nonprofit, nonpartisan institution devoted to the most powerful vision of freedom ever expressed: the U.S. Constitution. He is a professor at The George Washington University Law School, where he has taught since 1997, and is the legal affairs editor of The New Republic, which covers politics and culture from an “unbiased and thought-provoking perspective.”

Rosen is a highly regarded journalist whose essays and commentaries have appeared in the *New York Times Magazine*, *The Atlantic Monthly*, on National Public Radio, and in *The New Yorker*. The *Chicago Tribune* named him one of the 10 best magazine journalists in America and a reviewer for the *Los Angeles Times* called him “the nation’s most widely read and influential legal commentator.” He received the 2012 Golden Pen Award from the Legal Writing Institute for his “extraordinary contribution to the cause of better legal writing.”

Mr. Rosen is the author of several books and is a graduate of Harvard College, Oxford University, and Yale Law School.
