Drinking Water and Water Pollution Control State Revolving Funds (DWSRF & CWSRF)

## Wastewater Pollution Control Loans

- Section 319 Clean Water Act
- -Fed Gov provides "seed" money annually through a "capitalization grant" to Idaho's Wastewater Facility Loan Account (CWSRF)
- -I.C. 39-2637 Establishes the CWSRF
- Section 1452 Safe Drinking Water Act
- -Fed Gov provides "seed" money annually through a capitalization grant to Idaho's Drinking Water Loan Fund (DWSRF)
- -I.C. 39-7601
- \*State of Idaho matches 20%
- -Required by CWA and SDWA

#### IDEQ LOAN PROGRAM

- IDEQ Loans CWSRF and DWSRF monies out at below market interest rates
- -Authorized by I.C. 3626 and 7602
- -CWSRF fees used to pay for administration of the Loan Program
- Two Expectations:
- 1. Produce a repaired, replaced, or enhanced wastewater or drinking water facility.
- 2. Money will be paid back with interest, so that IDEQ may loan the money out again and the interest is used as a hedge against inflation.
- The Money "Revolves" through CWSRF and DWSRF with goal of becoming self-sustaining.

#### Fundable List - IUP

- Fundable List = "Shovel Ready Projects"
- Loan applicant may have a high priority rating, but to make the "Fundable List" they must show readiness to proceed.
- Intended Use Plan
- Projects most ready to proceed are placed in the Intended Use Plan which is Approved by the Board of Environmental Quality.

#### Readiness to Proceed

- DEQ Evaluates Projects Readiness to Proceed
  - Approved Plans and Specifications
  - Approved Facility or Master Plans
  - Bonds Passed to go into debt
  - Willingness to Accept Loan
  - Projects Not Ready to Proceed are Bypassed

- 71 Letters of Interest
- \$552 Million Requested
- \$59.2 Million available to loan
  - \$19.2 Million Stimulus
  - \$40.0 Million Standard SRF Funds

## **Stimulus Money Specifically**

- Principle Forgiveness Allowed by ARRA
- ARRA Waives State Match Requirement
- 100 % of Loan Contact or Project under Construction by Feb 16, 2010
- 50% Toward Subsidies
- 20% Toward Green Infrastructure
- Use American Manufactured Products
- Comply with ARRA Reporting Requirements
  - Accountability
  - Job Creation

#### 50% Subsidies – \$19.35M

- Offered to Disadvantage Communities
  - Eligible for Subsidy if User Rates are > 1.5% of the Median Household Income
  - Subsidy in the Form of Principal Forgiveness
  - Subsidy Amount Offered Enough to drop out of designation as a "Disadvantaged Community"
  - Spreads the Subsidy Amount Out over more Communities

20% Green Infrastructure – Energy Efficiency

- \$7.74M
- Wastewater Collection System Infiltration and Inflow Projects
- Drinking Water Distribution Leaking Repair
- Water Conservation Measures

- April 2009
  - Board Adoption of IUP
  - Governor's Office Decision to Accept Funds

#### Title and Sections of ARRA for Funding (2b)

- TITLE VII-INTERIOR, ENVIRONMENT, AND RELATED AGENCIES
- Sec. STATE AND TRIBAL ASSISTANCE GRANTS: \$4,000,000,000 shall be for capitalization grants for the Clean Water State Revolving Funds under title VI of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act and \$2,000,000,000 shall be for capitalization grants under section 1452 of the Safe Drinking Water Act...Provided further, That funds appropriated herein shall not be subject to the matching or cost share requirements of sections 602(b)(2), 602(b)(3) or 202 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act nor the matching requirements of section 1452(e) of the Safe Drinking Water Act.
