Jeffrey Rosen is President and CEO of the National Constitution Center and a professor at The George Washington University Law School. He is a nonresident senior fellow at the Brookings Institution, where he explores issues involving the future of technology and the Constitution. Mr. Rosen's essays and commentaries have appeared in the New York Times Magazine, The Atlantic Monthly, on National Public Radio, and in The New Yorker. Mr. Rosen is the author of several books including *The Supreme Court: The Personalities and Rivalries that Defined America*.
