Electronic Filing in Twin Falls County is Two Weeks Away
Training Sessions Available to Help Attorneys Prepare

In a week, all attorneys filing documents with the court in Twin Falls County will be required to do so electronically. **Mandatory e-filing starts on January 11, 2016.**

E-Filing allows documents to be filed, served, distributed and delivered electronically. This transition further supports the efficiencies gained by moving to an electronic court record by creating time savings for attorneys, clerks and judges.

To help attorneys prepare for the transition to an electronic filing system, the **Idaho Supreme Court is hosting several in-person trainings** to walk people through the process and answer questions. Trainings will take place on **January 7 and 8** at the Twin Falls County West Building, 630 Addison Ave. W. Trainings will be held at 10:30 a.m., 12:30 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. on January 7 and again at 10:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. on January 8. Each training session will last approximately an hour and a half.

Attorneys can currently e-file in Twin Falls County on a volunteer basis. E-Filing will allow you and your colleagues to file a document in a few minutes anytime of the day without ever leaving your office – saving you time and money.

As the Idaho courts continue to deploy the new case management system, e-filing will be implemented in additional counties and over the next couple of years will become mandatory across the State.
