

Ada County iCourt Transition Underway

Ada County is officially in the middle of its transition to the state's new electronic case management system. iCourt will go live in the county on Monday, August 8.

Services will be limited at the courthouse during the technology transition. To change to iCourt, the legacy system known as the Idaho Statewide Trial Court Automated System (ISTARS), was taken offline on Wednesday. Ada County courts will not be able to accept online payments, schedule criminal court dates or take new civil case filings, except for emergencies, until Monday when iCourt goes live.

On Friday, August 5, the Twin Falls Court will be closed for all but critical business to allow for the data from Ada County to convert into the iCourt system. iCourt was successfully launched in Twin Falls County last summer.

The iCourt system allows for better information exchange among judicial partners, provides around the clock access to court records and increases efficiencies in courtrooms across the state.

It is important to note that as part of the transition to iCourt, the Idaho Supreme Court Data Repository will be replaced by a new system known as the iCourt Portal. Once iCourt launches in Ada County, if you want to look up the status of a trial court case or search criminal records of an individual within Ada County you will need to visit <https://mycourts.idaho.gov>. The current information from the Court Data Repository for Ada County will transition to this new website. In two years, when iCourt is launched in all 44 counties, all court records will be located on the iCourt Portal.

iCourt goes live August 8 at 8am. During that week, citizens using court services should prepare for delays and be patient as employees get comfortable navigating the new system.
