Title: The Idaho State Bar Disciplinary Process

# Summary of Presentation:

- Discipline: Section 5 within the Bar Commission rules
- About 150 grievances so far this year; estimating approximately 600 this year, which is about 200 more than previous years.
- Lawyers are required to cooperate in process per Bar rules
  - o Confidentiality of client information can be waived
  - o Licenses can be suspended if no cooperation with reasonable requests
- Process starts with written grievance.
  - o There is a form.

- This grievance is confidential.
- Then an investigation follows.
  - o Initial review for alleged rule violations
  - o If no rule violation found, then dismissed
  - If there is a violation, then respondent lawyer has a chance to respond to the allegations.
- If no clear and convincing evidence of violation, investigation is discontinued
  - o Grievant can appeal to a hearing committee
- If clear and convincing evidence of violation is found, then discipline
  - o Informal discipline:
    - Private discipline; not disclosed to public unless consent from lawyer
    - For lesser violations
    - Bar can impose; no need for approval from hearing committee or Supreme Court to impose
  - Formal discipline:
    - Public discipline (i.e. public sanctions, public reprimand, disbarment, probation limiting license, suspension, etc.)
    - Hearing committee imposes
      - Appeal to Idaho Supreme Court if needed
