

Industrial Aquaculture

- Prohibit net pens in marine waters throughout the state
- Implement animal welfare standards for aquatic animals in food system



The Oregon Aquaculture Act

The State of Oregon has a duty to protect the state's natural resources and ecosystems and ensure humane treatment of animals raised for food. HB 2655 would regulate the treatment of aquatic animals in industrial aquaculture facilities and help protect the environment amidst significant industry expansion in Oregon. This legislation would also bring a diverse group of stakeholders to the table through the rulemaking process.

What is aquaculture?

Oregon State University defines aquaculture as the breeding, raising and harvesting of fish, shellfish and aquatic plants. Basically, it's farming in water." Aquaculture farms in Oregon raise oysters, clams, rout, bass, catfish, tilapia, and ornamental fish. Though Washington State is the largest producer of hatchery-reared and farmed shellfish in the United States, 2 the industry in Oregon is growing.

What is the impact of the Oregon Aquaculture Act?

The aquaculture industry in Oregon is growing. In 2021, the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration awarded Oregon State University with a \$700,000 grant to help grow the aquaculture industry in the state and create a replicable model for other states. 
