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# WHY BEAGLES?

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- At any given moment, there are approximately 65,000 dogs in laboratories in the United States being tested on.
- The testing industry likes to use beagles because they are specifically bred to be docile, friendly and forgiving. They won't fight back when they are being hurt.

**LEGISLATE!** Our signature legislation, “The Beagle Freedom Bill,” has become law in 11 states, mandating the release of dogs and cats healthy enough for adoption, when the testing is over, instead of of laboratories killing them.







## **BEAGLE FREEDOM BILL**

BFP's "signature" legislation mandating the release of dogs and cats from laboratories when the testing is over. Each state has different language, but for the most part, the facility must be publicly funded in some way (like a University or a facility receiving some public grants – except Nevada applies to private labs), and the animals must be "healthy" enough for release which is subjective.

Senator Kathleen Rice loved this bill so much that she introduced it federally. It is H.R. 2850, 116<sup>th</sup>

Because it has now been introduced federally, we have stopped advocating for state by state legislation.
