Mr. Graham led discussion of a possible CLE at the Bar's Annual Meeting based upon an article by Debora Grasham published in *Western Legal History* titled "The First Women of Idaho's Bench and Bar." Further discussion of the CLE was deferred to the March meeting and Ms. Baker indicated she would save a spot for this potential CLE. Mr. Graham also raised the Section's previously approved support of the Idaho Women Lawyers (IWL) Gala and the potential to build upon Ms. Grasham's work and to provide short biographies of female judges who served in Idaho on table centerpieces at the gala. Mr. Graham called for volunteers to join him on a committee to this end and volunteers included Judge Lorello, Ms. Fulfer, and Ms.

Mahoney. Mr. Graham informed attendees of a display of the Idaho Constitution occurring on February 1 in Pocatello and a tour to be led by David Leroy at the Lincoln exhibit at the Idaho History Center on February 16. Mr. McGown raised interviews of lawyers and judges at the Idaho History Society. Mr. Graham noted that the Section had received earmarked funds to obtain and transcribe oral histories and to publish the Tents to Towers project as either a hard copy book or an e-book. Ms. Baker initiated a discussion concerning a public television special, Mr. Kenyon noted that public television would be interested in specials on prominent historical cases and that he was seeking to have Judge Lodge participate in an oral history.
