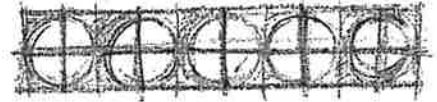

How to preserve issues for appeal

(no grant of power)

* Key is that constitution is limitation of legislature's power - legislature has power unless constitution says otherwise (ie. can't legislate in that regard). Look to constitution for what legislature can't do, no what it can do.
