



RELATING TO PUBLIC FUNDS; AMENDING CHAPTER 8, TITLE 57, IDAHO CODE, BY THE ADDITION OF A NEW SECTION 57-825, IDAHO CODE, TO ESTABLISH PROVISIONS REGARDING THE STATE-DIRECTED OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUND; AND DECLARING AN Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho: SECTION 1. That Chapter 8, Title 57, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a NEW SECTION, to be known and designated as Section 57-825, Idaho Code, and to read as follows: 57-825. STATE-DIRECTED OPIOID SETTLEMENT FUND -- USE OF FUND MONEYS --RECOMMENDATIONS. (1) There is hereby established in the state treasury the state-directed opioid settlement fund, to be managed by the state treasurer. Moneys in the fund shall consist of: (a) Moneys received by the state of Idaho pursuant to settlements and judgments obtained by the state relating to opioids; (b) Legislative appropriations to the fund; (c) Any beguests or donations to the fund; and (d) Interest earned on idle moneys in the fund. (2) Moneys in the state-directed opioid settlement fund shall be used as determined by legislative appropriation, provided that such moneys must be used only for purposes relating to opioid abuse prevention and recovery programs. (3) The Idaho behavioral health council shall meet as necessary and make recommendations to the joint finance-appropriations committee as to how moneys from the state-directed opioid settlement fund should be used. The provisions of this subsection shall be effective until July 29, 2024. SECTION 2. An emergency existing therefor, which emergency is hereby declared to exist, this act shall be in full force and effect on and after its

passage and approval.
