Of note: Under the new launch schedule, Blaine, Boise, Camas, Canyon, Cassia, Elmore, Gooding, Jerome, Lincoln, Minidoka, Owyhee and Valley Counties will transition to iCourt in October 2017. The Appellate (courts) section launch should follow in the Spring of 2018. Also presenting, Michael Mehall who answered questions about resolving procedural conflicts that are rising between judges and districts and how or if iCourt will be resolving these prior to full launching with the rest of the state.
